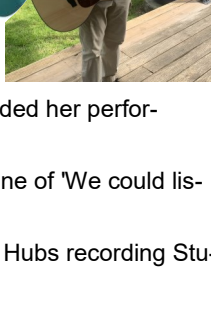

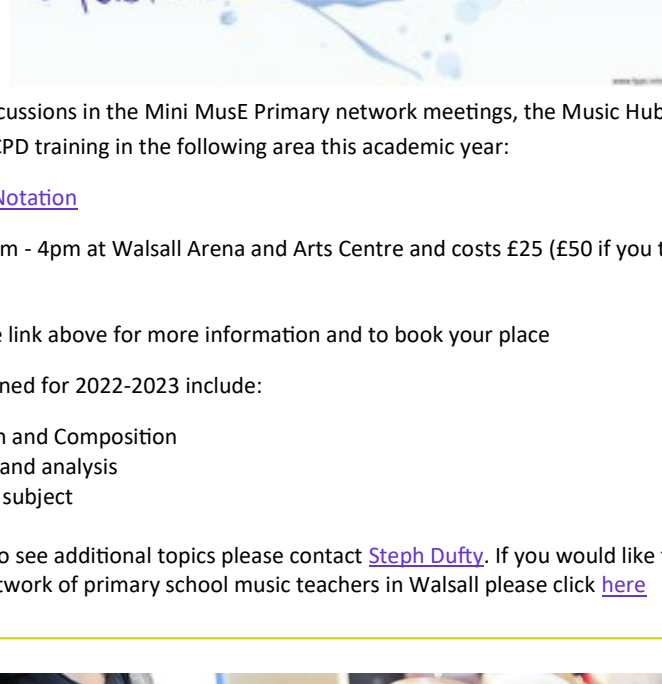


Jeevan Gill wins AMOW 22

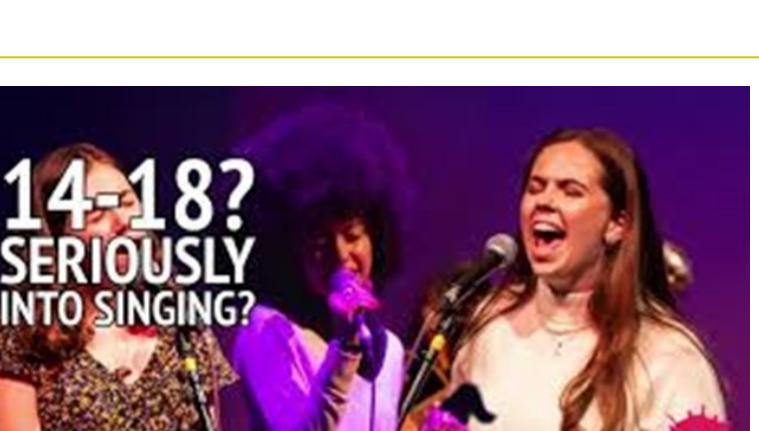
Session is from 1pm - 4pm at Walsall Arena and Arts Centre and costs £25 (£50 if you teach outside of Walsall).

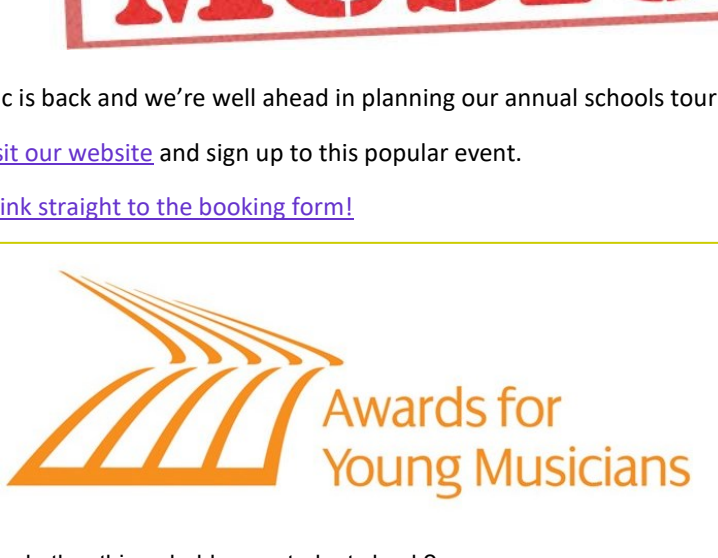


14-18? SERIOUSLY INTO SINGING?

There will be three workshops for your students throughout the day:

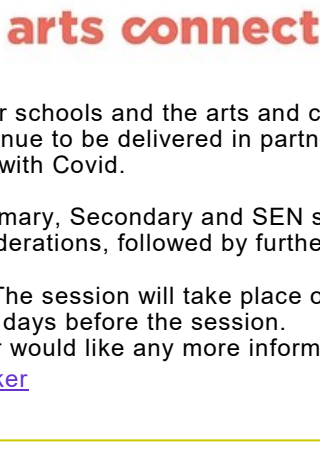
- Indonesian gamelan

Let's Connect – Tuesday 7th June | 4pm to 5pm | Online – Zoom | Free

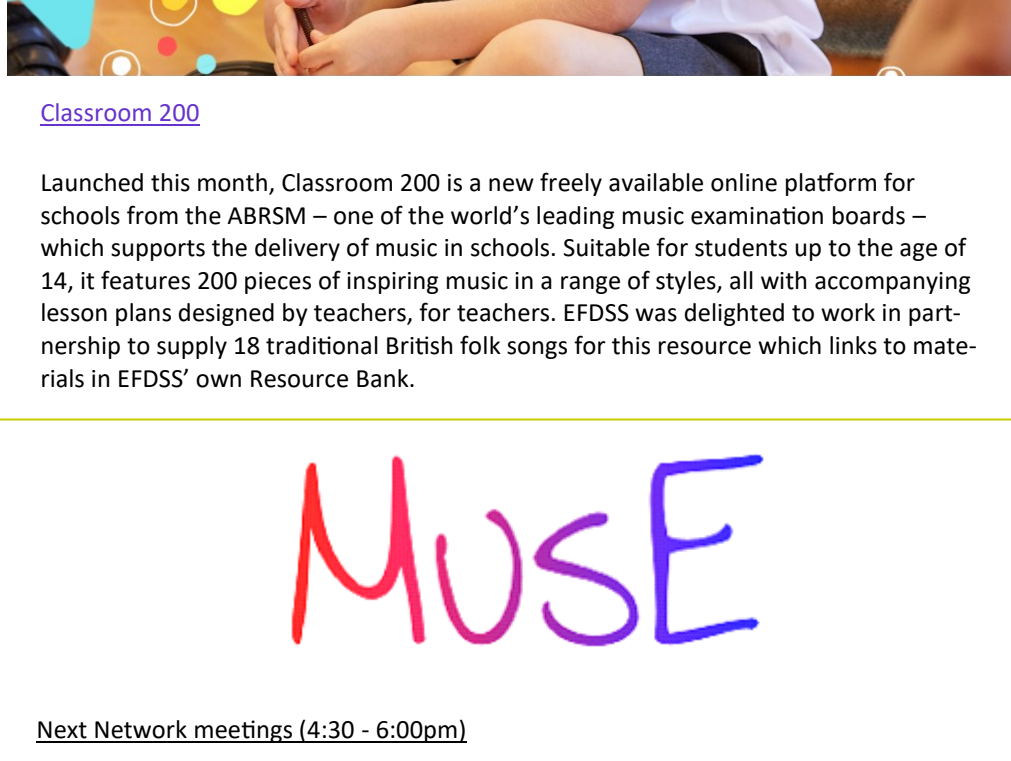
